BUSINESS ATTIRE

Pantsuit/woman's suit/dress with blazer:

- Dress/skirt: not too short (when standing, it should cover the knees; when sitting, it can end one hand width above knees)
- Trousers/skirt + blazer must have the same color
- Dress + blazer must match in color
- Proper blazer made of "suit fabric": no cardigan or fabric blazer
- No wild patterns, generally no pattern mix
- No white, or gaudy flashy (rather dark, muted colors)

Blouses:

- No (deep) cutout
- If possible, put it into trousers/skirts
- Blouses must cover shoulders or blazer must be kept on

Shoes:

- Heels: not necessary (for flat shoes, make sure that they are elegant)
- No peep toes
- Shoes should match handbag and belt

Bag:

- Handbag/laptop bag/briefcase/backpack
- Discreet colors

Accessories:

- Jewelry: discreet, e.g. no chunky chains / long earrings, no glitter
- No scarf; scarves only in an emergency in case of sore throat -> small, discreet scarf



- If possible, hair should be kept out of your face
- With open hair take care not to brush it behind the ear constantly etc.

Make Up:

- Not obligatory
- Maintain a polished and professional makeup look by opting for neutral tones and subtle application
- Avoid heavy or dramatic styles such as bright colors, smoky eyes, or overly bold features
