

Code of Conduct

[1] Purpose and Principles: This Code of Conduct outlines the standards of behavior expected from all participants at the BayernMUN-conference, including delegates, chairs, staff, and guests. Our aim is to create a respectful, inclusive, and intellectually stimulating environment that reflects the values of the United Nations: cooperation, mutual respect, and peace.

[2] Respect and Professionalism

- All participants must treat one another with courtesy, respect, and professionalism at all times.
- Discrimination, harassment, or bullying of any kind — including on the basis of gender, race, nationality, religion, sexual orientation, disability, or political opinion — will not be tolerated.
- Constructive debate and disagreement are encouraged, but personal attacks or derogatory remarks are strictly prohibited.
- We ask delegates to exclude from the content of their speeches, working papers, amendments or negotiations any remarks involving the situation in Gaza

[3] Academic Integrity

- Delegates must represent their assigned countries accurately and with intellectual honesty.
- Plagiarism or the use of uncredited sources in position papers, speeches, or resolutions is not permitted.
- All research and documentation must follow proper citation standards.

[4] Conduct During Sessions

- Delegates must follow the rules of procedure and respect the authority of the Chair.
- Electronic devices should be used only for research or note-taking relevant to the debate.
- Side conversations, disruptions, or inappropriate behavior during sessions are prohibited.
- Delegates have to adhere to the dress codes published on the BayernMUN-website

[5] Social Conduct and Networking

- Social events organized as part of the conference are meant to encourage friendship and exchange among participants.
- Alcohol consumption (if permitted by the organizers and local law) must be responsible and moderate.
- Any form of harassment, inappropriate behavior, or violation of local laws during social events will lead to disciplinary action.

[6] Safety and Well-Being

- Participants must follow all safety instructions provided by the organizers and venue staff.
- In case of emergencies or incidents, participants should immediately contact the Secretariat or designated Safety Officers.
- The organizers prioritize the physical and mental well-being of all participants.

[7] Consequences of Misconduct: Violations of this Code of Conduct may result in:

- Verbal or written warnings;
- Removal from sessions or events;
- Revocation of awards or certificates;
- Expulsion from the conference without refund;
- Notification to the participant's school or university, if applicable.

[8] Agreement: By participating in the Model United Nations Conference, all delegates and staff acknowledge that they have read, understood, and agree to abide by this Code of Conduct.
